

Key points discussed at Safer Oxfordshire Partnership (SOP) Co-ordination Group - 15 November 2017

Thames Valley Cybercrime Strategy

It was agreed that the Safer Oxfordshire Partnership supports the Thames Valley Cybercrime strategy in principle but there is still a need to agree who will coordinate this work on behalf of the partnership as it crosses over with work being undertaken by other countywide boards. This will be discussed at the Partnership Working Group towards the end of December.

Domestic Abuse

Sarah Carter briefed the group on activity that had been undertaken as part of the strategic review of domestic abuse and the high-level summit in June.

- A new strategic statement was agreed and this has been published on the Oxfordshire County Council Domestic Abuse webpage
- A new governance model has been agreed, with the Health Improvement Board as the accountable partnership for Domestic Abuse
- A co-commissioning approach has been agreed with district/ city councils, OCC and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner which will pool funding to commission Domestic Abuse specialist services
- A workforce development plan (for core agency staff) has been agreed by the safeguarding Boards and will be driven forward by the Strategic Board for Domestic Abuse (which will report to the Health Improvement Board)

It was agreed at the meeting that an annual Domestic Homicide Reviews report giving details of key learning both in terms of process and findings would be developed by the Strategic Lead for Domestic Abuse.

Information Sharing Protocol

It was agreed that the current Information Sharing protocol, which had served partners well, would be reviewed so that it reflects the new General Data Protection Mark regulations which come into force next May 2018.

Children and Young People's Plan

The partnership provided feedback on the development of the new plan.
