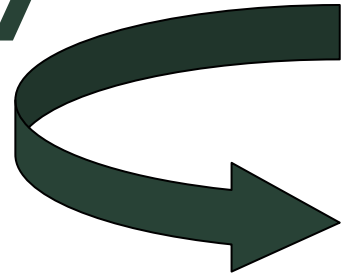


# Oxfordshire Way

## Points of interest from Rycote to Tetsworth

### Points of interest

**A** **Rycote** is one of the most remote and fascinating settlements along the Oxfordshire Way. The **chapel** was consecrated in 1449 and restored and opened to the public in 1967. Henry VIII, Elizabeth I, James I and Charles I were all visitors at Rycote Park and worshipped in the chapel, which accounts for the splendour of the royal pew. **Rycote Park** fits peacefully into its setting. It was much larger originally but much of it was burned down in 1745. The ruins were finally cleared from the site in 1800 and the turret and some stable buildings that survived were converted into the present house around 1920.

**B** **Tetsworth** has **sixteen listed buildings** as well as modern development, the latter due to its proximity to the A40 and now the M40. **The Swan Hotel** is an Elizabethan coaching inn, remodelled about 1700.



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
