

Red Amber Green (RAG) Table

This table sets out the proposed new framework for delegation and training based on a risk assessment approach.

Decisions on the level of training required for individual clients and healthcare tasks will be made by a healthcare professional.


Low risk Delegated healthcare tasks may not require NHS training.

Medium risk Delegated healthcare tasks require NHS training but any training completed can be

via the passport approach i.e. carers will be awarded portable competencies,

eliminating the need for repeat training for new clients.

<u>High risk</u> Delegated healthcare tasks require client specific training.



Risk Assessment

To aid clinical decision making, descriptors will be provided for all delegated healthcare tasks to support allocation to Red, Amber or Green (RAG) status.
