

## How to access and deliver to the main city centre streets:

### Cornmarket

All traffic is banned, except for deliveries to the street between 6pm and 10am. Delivery vehicles must approach from the south (via the **green zone**) and leave via Magdalen St West (in the **yellow zone**). The left turn into George St is banned. Cyclists are also allowed between 6pm and 10am.

### High Street

No vehicles (except buses, taxis and cycles) are permitted to pass through the bus gate restriction point between 7.30am and 6.30pm. Therefore between these hours vehicles will have to leave in the same direction from which they entered the High St. The western end of High St should be accessed via the **green zone**, whilst the eastern end of High St should be accessed via the **blue zone**. Some on-street loading restrictions also apply, except for in the loading bays (see map).

### Queen Street

Buses only, except between 6pm and 10am when cyclists and deliveries to the street are permitted. Access is via the **yellow zone** and exit via the **green zone**.

### Magdalen Street East

No access at any time except for local buses and taxis. An exception is made for deliveries to premises in the street between 6pm and 10 am, but exit must be made via Magdalen St (West).

### George Street

No access through the bus gate restriction except for buses and taxis. Delivery vehicles may pass through the gate between 6pm and 10am but only to load/unload in George St or Magdalen St West.

### Turl Street / Market Street

Between 10am and 6pm, only delivery vehicles less than 5m long are allowed in Turl St and Market St. Entry/exit via the **pink zone** only. Larger delivery vehicles are permitted outside these hours when they are allowed to exit via Cornmarket (northbound only).

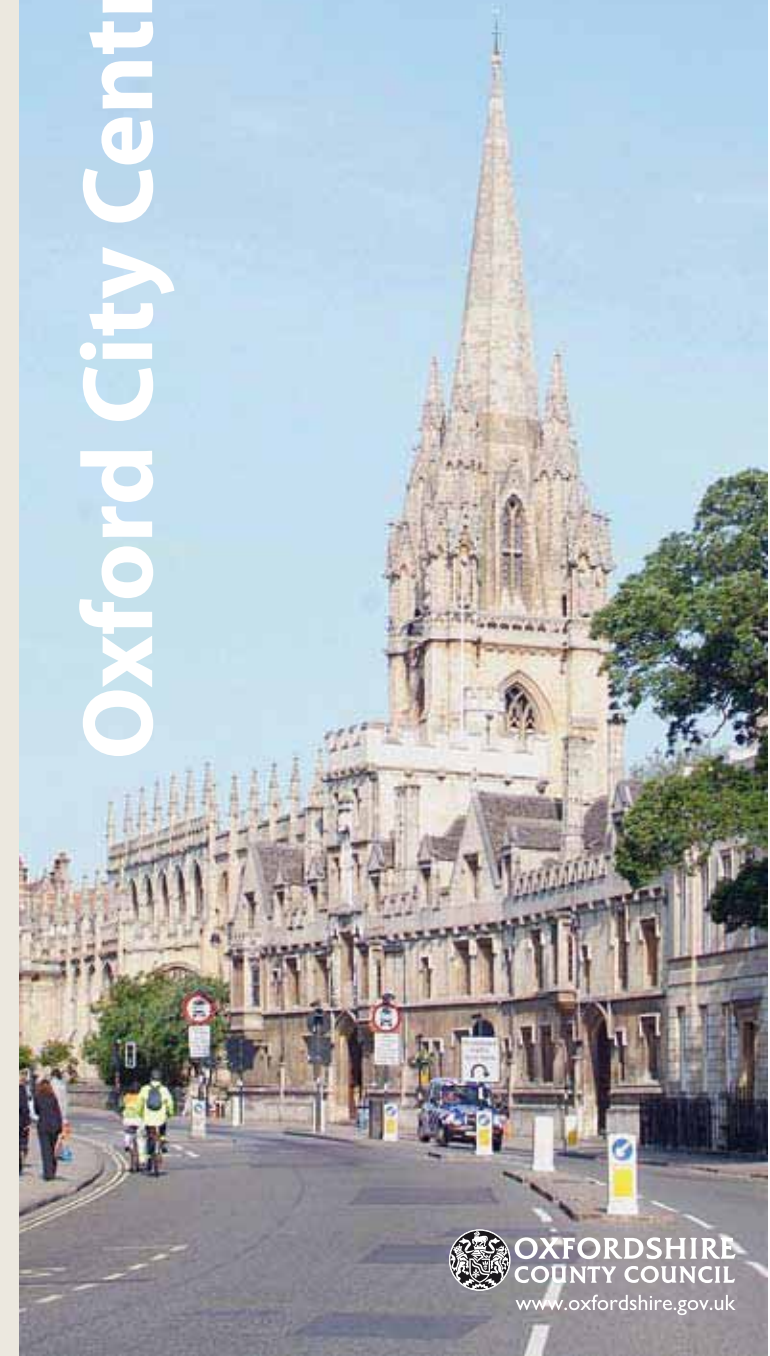

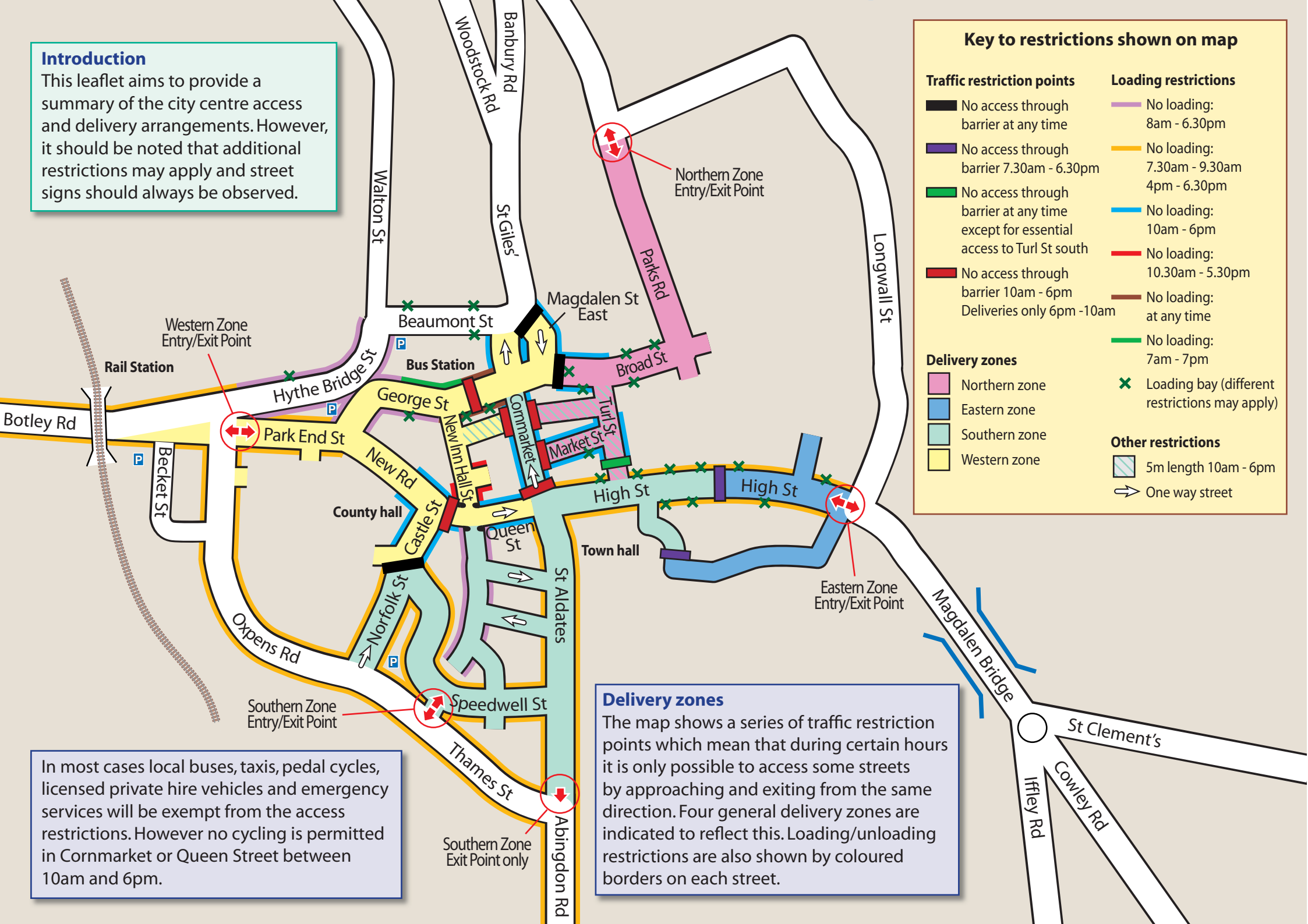

## Introduction

This leaflet aims to provide a summary of the city centre access and delivery arrangements. However, it should be noted that additional restrictions may apply and street signs should always be observed.



## Key to restrictions shown on map

### Traffic restriction points

- No access through barrier at any time
- No access through barrier 7.30am - 6.30pm
- No access through barrier at any time except for essential access to Turl St south
- No access through barrier 10am - 6pm Deliveries only 6pm - 10am

### Loading restrictions

- No loading: 8am - 6.30pm
- No loading: 7.30am - 9.30am 4pm - 6.30pm
- No loading: 10am - 6pm
- No loading: 10.30am - 5.30pm
- No loading: at any time
- No loading: 7am - 7pm
- Loading bay (different restrictions may apply)

### Delivery zones

- Northern zone
- Eastern zone
- Southern zone
- Western zone

### Other restrictions

- 5m length 10am - 6pm
- One way street

## Delivery zones

The map shows a series of traffic restriction points which mean that during certain hours it is only possible to access some streets by approaching and exiting from the same direction. Four general delivery zones are indicated to reflect this. Loading/unloading restrictions are also shown by coloured borders on each street.

In most cases local buses, taxis, pedal cycles, licensed private hire vehicles and emergency services will be exempt from the access restrictions. However no cycling is permitted in Cornmarket or Queen Street between 10am and 6pm.
